FAIRLEIGH DICKINSON UNIVERSITY GLOBAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Fairleigh Dickinson University was founded in 1942 as an institution “of and for the world”—a principle that guides its Global Scholars Program. As a Global Scholar, you will be part of a distinctive learning community committed to a global perspective in which breadth of knowledge, cross-cultural understanding, and ethical actions create a more harmonious and prosperous world. Fairleigh Dickinson’s recognition as a leader in global education has led to a special relationship with the United Nations—a relationship that provides unique opportunities for its faculty and students. Moreover, the University’s commitment to global education has guided the development of international campuses in the U.K. and Canada, in addition to its main campuses in the U.S.—four campuses in all, each an integral part of a truly global university.

The Global Scholars Program embodies the University’s core mission to educate global citizens. Many graduates of the University have in fact held major positions of public service in Canada, the U.S. and worldwide. The University views investing in such students as an investment in the future of the world, and students admitted to the Global Scholars Program receive a Global Scholars Scholarship ranging from \$18,060 to \$60,190 USD for the duration of their degree program in business administration, information technology, or individualized studies.

Entrance requirements to the Global Scholars Program include a high school GPA of 80% or higher (or equivalent), adequate proficiency in English, and evidence of participation in school and/or community activities of global importance. Students with a high school GPA of 76% and exemplary school and/or community service with a global emphasis may also be considered. Admission to the Global Scholars Program is highly competitive and is limited to just 15-20 students each academic year.

Global Scholars have unique opportunities for experiential learning, including:

- A Global Scholars Seminar
- United Nations visitations with opportunities for private briefings and internships
- Lectures and receptions with ambassadors and international scholars
- Participation in special cultural and artistic events
- Regular interaction with Global Scholars on other FDU campuses
- Study abroad at the University’s campuses in the U.S. and U.K., and around the world

Fairleigh Dickinson University is a private, not-for-profit university with special accreditation as a non-governmental organization (NGO) with the U.N. Department of Public Information and recently received special consultative status from the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). Since 2002, when the University’s United Nations Pathway program began, more than 70 ambassadors and heads of state have lectured at FDU. These recognitions are unique for a university, especially a university in British Columbia, and FDU faculty and students enjoy special access to United Nations facilities and programs because of these recognitions.

Moreover, Fairleigh Dickinson University has maintained its global mission for over 65 years. The University’s founder, Dr. Peter Sammartino, created the International Association of University Presidents in 1964 to advance his vision of international education, and current FDU President, Dr. J. Michael Adams, is President-elect of this same association. Walter D. Head, the 29th President of Rotary International and former Provost of FDU’s Metropolitan Campus, was a member of the U.S. delegation that participated in the creation of the United Nations in 1945. As a Global Scholar, you will be part of a tradition of excellence and will add to a history of outstanding service.
